Our teen group has been starting to read and focus on the book 7 Habits of Highly Effective Teens. This past month they have been learning about the habit BE PROACTIVE. We had some great discussions with the youth about what that means to be proactive and what this might look like in their day-to-day lives.

Ever since these discussions we've been thinking about this attribute and how it relates to the Columbus Education Center. As you may know they're are over 10,000 immigrants/refugees who have come to make Herriman their new home. Many of these student's have been through horrible, traumatic and devastating situations. Many are looking for a new start and a safe place to raise their family. Their lives are much like each of ours. They want what is best for their children and want a good place to call home.

There are many cities around the country experiencing similar situations as we are here in Herriman. The thing I love about the Columbus Center is we are not a political affiliated organization. We don't ask about our students citizenship status or where they came from. We are a non profit organization trying to be 'proactive' and help people who need help. We are not here to judge, but simply love. It would be easy for our community to turn a blind eye to the needs of our residents. However, we are seeing the fruits of our labors as our community has rallied around each other and chosen a proactive solution instead.

We know immigration is an intense topic at this time in our country and we appreciate your willingness to put these feelings aside and serve the way we would want to be served if we were in their shoes. Until we've walked a mile in someone else's shoes, we would be wise to love instead of judge.

Teaching English is something I always wanted to do, and I was thrilled when the opportunity came.


What would you share with someone trying to decide if they should volunteer at the CAEC?



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


